Relative to this, the CLHRDC is now accepting papers that are aligned with the following research areas, namely: Nutrition and Food Safety, Maternal and Child Health, Technology and Innovations for Health, Sexuality and Reproductive Health, Health Service Delivery and Health Workforce, Financial Risk Protection, Communicable Diseases, Disaster Risk Reduction for Health, Diseases of Urbanization and Industrialization, Health of an Ageing Population, Health Research Governance and Indigenous Peoples' Health.

The following are this year's contests:

- 1.) Oral Research Presentation (Professional & Undergraduate Category)
- 2.) Digital Poster Research Contest (Professional & Undergraduate Category)
- 3.) 3-Minute Pitch to Policymakers (Professional Category)

The paper to be submitted for the Professional Category should have been completed at least the year 2019. The extended abstract to be submitted which should not exceed 1,000 words should have the following parts: Introduction, Objective/s, Methodology, Results & Discussion and Conclusion. The title, headings and key words on the topic investigated should likewise be included. If applicable, interested researchers are required to attach research authorization/clearance permit for the following specific studies:

- 1.) For studies which involved humans-ethics clearance, NCIP Permit, if applicable;

- 2.) For studies which used biological materials where genetic manipulation is involved or introduction of exotic or imported plants, microorganisms or animals-biosafety permit; and
- 3.) For studies which covered the protected areas of the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR)-gratuitous permit.
