This Office endorses to all state universities and colleges (SUCs), local colleges (LCs), and private higher education institutions (PHEIs) in Central Luzon, to urge their respective students to watch the movie entitled, "The Blind Soldiers" (Surrender Is Not An Option), as an educational material in support to CHED Memorandum Order (CMO) Nos. 01 and 02, series of 2019 on the Integration of Peace Studies/Education and Indigenous Peoples' Studies into the Relevant Higher Education Curricula.

The said film is a tribute in honor of the patriotism of the unsung heroes of World War II who were conscripted in the USAFFE in 1941. This film was chosen as a finalist by the Saskatchewan International Film Festival and is scheduled to be shown in Canada on October 14-21, 2023, at the Reel Attractions Theater, City of Humboldt, Saskatchewan. More importantly, the screening of this film in the country will be on September 15-19, 2023 in selected SM and Robinsons Cinemas nationwide.

RESOLUTION No. 658 - 2022

RESOLUTION ENDORSING TO ALL STATE UNIVERSITIES AND COLLEGES (SUCs), LOCAL UNIVERSITIES AND COLLEGES (LUCs), AND PRIVATE HIGHER **EDUCATION** INSTITUTIONS (PHEIs), TO RESPECTIVE STUDENTS TO WATCH THE MOVIE ENTITLED "THE BLIND SOLDIERS" AS AN EDUCATIONAL MATERIAL IN SUPPORT TO CHED MEMORANDUM ORDER (CMO) NOS. 01 AND 02, SERIES OF 2019 ON THE OF PEACE STUDIES/EDUCATION AND **INDIGENOUS** PEOPLES' STUDIES INTO THE RELEVANT HIGHER **EDUCATION CURRICULA**

WHEREAS, Article XIV Section 1 of the 1987 Philippine Constitution states: The State shall protect and promote the right of all citizens to quality education at all levels, and shall take appropriate steps to make such education accessible to all;

WHEREAS, there is need to find creative ways on how to teach and train our students to engage in active debates and discussions on how they will deepen their knowledge on patriotism, peace, justice, respect, love, and awareness of Indigenous Peoples' (IP) rights and lead them to appreciate the role of the Indigenous Peoples as partners in development and further motivate them to deepen their knowledge and appreciation of the IP culture being the bedrock of a genuine Filipino culture;

WHEREAS, there is a need to inculcate and promote Indigenous Peoples' awareness, patriotism, peace, justice, respect, love, among Filipino students through arts and movies;

WHEREAS, the movie "The Blind Soldiers" demonstrates the Indigenous Peoples inherent love for their country as able defenders of the rights of the people while further demonstrating the values of education, patriotism, peace, justice, respect, and love;

WHEREAS, "The Blind Soldiers" is a historical depiction of the life of five uneducated IP young men from Upi, Maguindanao belonging to the Teduray tribe, who despite their educational infirmity applied to be conscripted into the United States Armed Forces in the Far East (USAFFE) during the Second World War to help defend the country from the Japanese invaders;

WHEREAS, the showing of "The Blind Soldiers" shall be in connection with the integration of Peace Education and Indigenous Peoples Education in the Social Science subjects and its allied courses and in the relevant higher education curricula, pursuant to CHED Memorandum Order (CMO) Nos. 01 and 02, Series of 2019;

WHEREAS, "The Blind Soldiers" carries the values of the importance of education including patriotism, peace, justice, respect, and love among others and is a "dramedy" (drama-action-comedy) film directed by actor-director Commissioner Ronald L. Adamat;

WHEREAS, the Commission on Higher Education (CHED) has a history of endorsing films as a way of promoting culture, history, and values education that very recently it has partnered with CINEISKOOL which showcased ten (10) short films produced under the CineIskool Short Film Lab and Festival in a premiere and awards night held at the Gateway Mall, Quezon City on 22 June 2022;

NOW, THEREFORE, in view of the foregoing, be it:

RESOLVED, AS IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, that upon discussion and agreement, with the concurrence of the Management Committee, the Commission approved to endorse the movie "The Blind Soldiers" to all State Universities and Colleges (SUCs), Local Universities and Colleges (LUCs), and Private Higher Education Institutions (PHEIs) for the viewing of their respective students as an educational material in support of CHED Memorandum Order (CMO) Nos. 01 and 02, Series of 2019, respectively known as the "Integration of Peace Studies/Education into the Relevant Higher Education Curricula" and "Integration of Indigenous Peoples Studies into the Relevant Higher Education Curricula" through a Memorandum from the Office of the CHED Chairperson.

Adamat, CHED Commissioner, as its top biller, producer, and co-director, other notable actors such as Long Mejia, Soliman Cruz, Bong Cabrera, and Gary Lim, whom all portray the Teduray conscripts that underwent training and preparation to fight against the Japanese invaders as part of the USAFFE soldiers, will undoubtedly serve as a source of inspiration for our youth.

Moreover, Commissioner Adamat has successfully implemented the integration of peace studies/education and indigenous peoples' studies/education, recognizing that academic communities can promote these disciplines. This transformational effort can help shape the youth, who are the future of the country and the foundation of Philippine society, into becoming agents of peace.

Therefore, the undersigned would like to extend our unwavering support to VIVA Films, the sole distributor of the film. We will actively encourage and invite members of our academic communities to watch **"The Blind Soldiers"** once it is released in movie theaters nationwide.
