

V. CONTEST GUIDELINES

GENERAL GUIDELINES

- Eligibility. There should be only one (1) contest entry per campus student publication. Only the
 publications which have filled-out the contest form shall be accepted as official entries.
- Registration Fee. An amount of 1,000.00 pesos shall be paid as registration fee of the publication per contest entry. Payment shall be deposited to the bank account of the association:

- Registration Form. Complete the <u>YIPFC Delegation Registration Form</u> thru
 https://bit.ly/yjpfc2024delegation. Moreover, upload the copy of the deposit slip of full payment
 to the above-mentioned account to the same link. The online form should be submitted on or
 before August 5, 2024.
- Submission. The Committee will only accept group entries thru this link: https://bit.ly/yjpfc2024groupentry. The deadline for submission is on August 12, 2024. Failure to comply with any of these requirements shall disqualify the paper from the contests.
- Entry. The publication should check if the required Uniform Resource Locator (URL) or link for submission is working.
- Originality. The entry to be submitted should be an original work of the student publication. If the
 entry is proven to have committed plagiarism in any way, even if unintentional, the entry will be
 disqualified or, if the unethical act was discovered after the contest, then the award and
 recognition will be revoked.
- 7. Scoring. The contest shall be judged based on the number of points garnered by the campus publication from the categories. The distribution of points shall follow the scheme below:

Awarding. The top ten publications in each contest category shall be recognized as winners and
will receive certificates and plaques of recognition. Additionally, the top ten highest-scoring
publications in across all categories will be recognized as the A-Listers for the Social Media Page,

E-Magazine, and News Broadcast Production, Vertical Short Form Video and will receive plaques of recognition. The computed points for Vertical Short Form Video, Social Media Page, E-Magazine, and News Broadcast Production shall determine the A-List Campus Media.

- 9. The awarding ceremony shall be held during the Young Journalists Press Freedom Congress.
- Upon arrival and registration, the participating institution must submit a copy of the CHED-RO III acknowledgement letter concerning the Certificate of Compliance and Report of Compliance (CHED CMO No. 63, S. 2017).

GROUP CONTESTS GUIDELINES

- A. A-LIST SOCIAL MEDIA PAGE FOR STUDENT PUBLICATION. The search for the best social media page for a student publication aims to identify and recognize outstanding online platforms that effectively engage, inform, and connect their audience through creative and impactful content.
 - The entries eligible for evaluation shall be those which have been published in the official social media page of the publication during the period of August 31, 2023 to July 31, 2024 only.
 - The publication shall submit one article per category, including the URL/link for each entry, in the following categories:
 - Best in News Entry
 - b. Best in Editorial Entry
 - c. Best in Opinion Entry
 - d. Best in Sports Entry
 - e. Best in Literary Entry
 - f. Best in Feature Entry
 - g. Best in Devcomm Entry
 - Best in Infographics Entry
 - Best in News Photo Entry
 - j. Best Literary Graphic Entry
 k. Best Comics Entry
 - 3. All entries should be identified with writer/photojournalist/graphic editor/illustrator's name.
 - 4. News photo entry should have at least six (5) photos but not more than ten (10).
 - Failure to submit one or more entries in this group contest will not result in disqualification of the publication, provided that at least one entry is submitted.
- B. A-LIST VERTICAL SHORT-FORM VIDEO. The search for the best vertical short-form video features the most engaging, creative, and impactful videos designed for vertical viewing on digital devices and platforms.
 - The entries eligible for evaluation shall be those that have been published online on the official social media page of the publication between August 31, 2023, and July 31, 2024, only.

- The entry should be a brief video explainer of recent events, or development, or policy within their
 respective educational institutions. It must be an original composition made by the members of
 the student publication. The entries may draw inspiration from "Patrol ng Pilipino" vertical short
 videos. (e.g., ABS-CBN Innovation Award, MT Princess Empress Oil Spill, DZMM630 Call Sign,
 LGBTQIA+ Right to Care Card)
- Video entries should not have been finalists in any similar video-making contest. Otherwise, the Secretariat Committee will disregard the entry.
- 4. The time duration should not be less than one (1:00) minute (including credits) and should not exceed more than two minutes and twenty seconds (2:20). The resolution of the entry should be 1080p x 1920p (or 9:16) to fill a standard mobile screen (vertical). Entries shall be submitted in .mp4 or .mov file format with the prescribed file name: YJPFC-2023_Short-Form Video_Publication (Example: YJPFC-2024_Short-Form Video_The Publication)
- The following are the criteria for judging: content quality, originality and creativity, production quality, and entertainment value.
- C. A-LIST E-MAGAZINE. The search for the best e-magazine aims to recognize digital magazines that excel in content quality, design, and user engagement.
 - The entries eligible for evaluation shall be those which have been published online thru https://issuu.com during the period of August 31, 2023 to July 31, 2024 only.
 - The e-magazine entry of the publication shall cover the Academic Year 2023-2024. Previous publication submitted in the previous regional and Luzon-wide press conference are not accepted.
 - 3. The publication shall submit one e-magazine entry with working issuu.com direct URL/link.
 - Standard sizes of the electronic copy of the magazine shall be observed as stated below. The
 decision of the YJPFC Secretariat shall be respected in determining acceptance of entries
 deviating from the standard size.
 - 5. The document size of the entry should be 9" x 12" with 300 pixels per inch (PPI) resolution.
 - The following shall be the categories:
 - a. Best in News/ Reports
 - b. Best in Sports
 - c. Best in Editorial
 - d. Best in Opinion
 - e. Best in Literary
 - f. Best in Features
 - g. Best in Devcomm
 - h. Best in Photos
 - Best in Cover Design
 - j. Best in Layout Design

- D. A-LIST NEWS BROADCAST PRODUCTION. The competition evaluates the overall quality of a fourminute news video production.
 - The entries eligible for evaluation shall be those that have been published online on the official social media page or channel of the publication between August 31, 2023, and July 31, 2024, only.
 - Video entries should not have been finalists in any similar video-making contest. Otherwise, the Secretariat Committee will disregard the entry.
 - The time duration should not be less than three (5:00) minutes (including credits) and should not exceed more than four minutes (7:00).
 - The resolution of the entry should be 1920p x 1080p (or 16:9) to fill a standard mobile screen (horizontal). Entries shall be submitted in .mp4 or .mov file format with the prescribed file name format: YJPFC-2023_News Broadcast_Publication (Example: YJPFC-2024_News Broadcast_The Publication)
 - 5. The following are the expected content of the news broadcast:
 - Opening Billboard and Closing Billboard. This contains the campus paper/ student publication's program/ channel title.
 - Headlines. This will contain a brief lead/summary of the news articles.
 - Field Report. This includes a live field report supported by canned footage as part of the production.
 - 6. The following shall be the categories:
 - a. Best News Story
 - b. Best News Anchor
 - c. Best News Reporter
 - d. Best Technical Director
 - e. Best News Script

SPECIAL AWARDS GUIDELINES

- A. SEARCH FOR THE OUTSTANDING TERTIARY CAMPUS JOURNALISTS (OTCJ). This event shall recognize and celebrate the exceptional talent and dedication of tertiary campus journalists for their leadership, excellence, and community contributions in in Central Luzon.
 - This search is open to both graduating students and recent graduates of the current academic year 2023-2024 who were campus journalists at the tertiary level. Previous recipients of this award are not eligible to participate again.
 - 2. There is no limit to the number of nominees that each campus student publication can submit.
 - The Nomination Document shall be in a single, A4-sized (8.3 x 11.7") portable data format (pdf) file containing the following:
 - a. Application letter for the OTCJ award;
 - Recommendation letter from the school paper adviser or moderator;

- OTCJ Nomination Form (link to this document:) detailing the nominee's accomplishments during the period of 2019-2024 only; and
- d. Appendices consisted of the supporting documents covering the said period.
- The student publication through its authorized representative will submit the Nomination Document to the Regional Committee thru this link: https://bit.ly/yjpfc2024specialawards.
- Nominees shall submit the documents on or before June 7, 2024 through Google Forms. The file name of the document shall adhere to the prescribed format, YJPFC-2024_OTCJ_Last Name_Publication (Example: YJPFC-2024_OTCJ_Cabal_The Publication). Please refer to the schedule:

- During the search, the Nomination Documents shall be evaluated by a Regional Committee
 composed of the ATSPAR III Inc. Board of Trustees. The Committee shall be granted the authority
 to accept or reject applications based on submitted documents and existing records of the
 association.
- 7. The evaluation for OTCJ shall comprise the initial and final screening stages:
 - a. Initial Screening. The evaluation committee shall use a set of standard criteria from which a rubric in identifying specific points shall be based. Only those who meet the minimum required points of 75 shall qualify for the award, and pass the initial screening.
 - Final Screening. If the number of qualifiers reaches more than 10, only the top ten in the ranking shall be recognized as Outstanding Tertiary Campus Journalists (OTCJ).
- 8. Criteria. The following will be the criteria for evaluation:

- B. CAMPUS JOURNALISM ADVOCATE AWARD. The Campus Journalism Advocate Award is an esteemed recognition conferred by the Association of Tertiary School Paper Advisers of Region III (ATSPAR III), Inc. This award honors the dedication, commitment, and service of campus paper advisers who have significantly contributed to the field of campus journalism. It acknowledges their pivotal role in nurturing student journalists and fostering a culture of journalistic excellence within educational institutions.
 - This search is open to all active ATSPAR III Inc. members and will cover the period of year 2000 to present year.
 - The Campus Journalism Advocate Award is categorized based on the exact number of years of continuous service in student publication:

Years in Service*	Award
5 years	Campus Journalism Advocate Bronze Award
10 years	Campus Journalism Advocate Silver Award
15 years	Campus Journalism Advocate Gold Award
20 years	Campus Journalism Advocate Platinum Award

- The main criteria shall be the number of successive years rendered as adviser, moderator or consultant of the school paper.
- To claim the years in service, the supporting documents would include Oath of Office, or Designations, or Certifications. Documents be evaluated by a regional committee.
- Along with a letter of intent, applications should be submitted to ATSPAR III Inc. via email at atspar3@gmail.com. The deadline for submission is until August 5, 2024 only.
- The student publication through its authorized representative will submit the Nomination Document to the Regional Committee through this link: https://bit.ly/yjpfc2024specialawards
- The recipients of CJA will receive plaques and certificates. The awarding ceremony shall be held during the Young Journalists' Press Freedom Congress.
