CONCEPT NOTE

BAGONG PILIPINAS ROADSHOW FOR A FREE, PEACEFUL, AND SECURE NATION

Duration: July 2024 - 2025

1. BACKGROUND/DETAILS.

Objectives. The "Bagong Pilipinas Roadshow for a Free, Peaceful, and Secure Nation" aims to disseminate and advocate the National Security Policy 2023-2028 and the National Security Strategy 2024, incorporating the Bagong Pilipinas governance brand, to foster a free, peaceful, and secure Philippines.

This initiative seeks to engage stakeholders from all sectors, raise awareness on key national security issues, and mobilize support for government efforts, particularly in addressing internal threats and safeguarding territorial integrity.

Key topics will include the National Security Policy (NSP), National Security Strategy (NSS), anti-communist insurgency efforts through the National Task Force to End Local Communist Armed Conflict (NTF-ELCAC), and territorial integrity and adherence to international law in the West Philippine Sea through the National Task Force West Philippine Sea (NTF WPS).

1.2. Implementation Plan/Proposed Program of Activities. Convergence efforts will focus on achieving a free, peaceful, and secure nation and asserting our rights in the West Philippine Sea.

The National Security Council (NSC) and the Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG) will lead the advocacy efforts, in collaboration with various government agencies and non-government organizations, including the following:

1.3. Roadshow Activities

Day 1

a. Takbo Para sa WPS

This activity raises public awareness and support for safeguarding our sovereign rights and interests in the West Philippine Sea, engaging stakeholders and communities, and demonstrating our commitment to national security and maritime integrity.

Lead Agency: PCG
Target Number of Participants: 5,000 runners

b. Mall Photo Exhibit

This one-week exhibit raises awareness of the West Philippine Sea's importance and challenges. Through visual displays and informative narratives, it engages mail-goers in meaningful conversations, fostering stewardship and inspiring advocacy to protect the sea's sovereignty and marine resources.

Lead Group: Atin Ito Coalition
Target Number of Reach: 10,000 mall-goers

Day 2

c. Pambansang Seguridad Tungo sa Pag-Unlad

This morning multi-sectoral event promotes national security awareness through keynote speeches, policy discussions, and peace-building presentations. It fosters collaboration to address security challenges and emphasizes safeguarding the Philippines' West Philippine Sea rights, encouraging community-driven maritime security initiatives.

Lead Agencies: DILG and NSC

Target Number of Participants: 1,000 local officials and participants from the general public

d. Roadshow Press Conference

This noontime event disseminates key messages on national security, emphasizing collaboration and collective action. It informs stakeholders

about security policy, peace-building efforts, and safeguarding the Philippines' West Philippine Sea rights, highlighting community-driven maritime security initiatives.

Lead Agencies: PCO and PIA

Target Number of Participants: 100 local media professionals [See Annex D for the program of this activity.]

e. Waves of Contention:

Issues, Prospects, and Challenges of the West Philippine Sea

This afternoon seminar series (Campus and Media Caravan) for students, faculty, and local media aims to educate on the geopolitical and legal complexities of the West Philippine Sea. Interactive sessions will cover historical backgrounds, legal frameworks, and the Philippines' rights, while promoting responsible journalism. Open forums will foster dialogue and reinforce key insights.

Lead Agencies: CHED, PCO, and PIA

Target Number of Participants: 500 students, 50 faculty members, and 100 local media professionals [See Annex E for the program of this activity.]

f. Local Voices for National Security

(LGU Consultation on NSP-NSS)

This afternoon consultation will gather LGUs and key stakeholders to discuss national security. The event aims to collect insights and recommendations to inform national security policies and strategies. By fostering collaboration between LGUs and national agencies, it seeks to enhance grassroots security measures and ensure a cohesive approach to regional security challenges.

Lead Agency: NSC and DILG

Target Number of Participants: 150 local officials composing the Peace and Order Council, and representatives from other pillars of the criminal justice system (police, prosecution service, courts, jail, and corrections)

Day 3

g. OPLAN LAYAG

This activity supports local fishermen in areas, particularly those who reside in areas facing the West Philippine Sea by providing them with fishing boats. This initiative aims to enhance the livelihoods of Filipino fishermen, promote sustainable fishing practices, and strengthen the presence and activities of local communities in the West Philippine Sea.

Lead Agency: BFAR

Target Number of Participants: 50-100 fisher-beneficiaries [See Annex G for the program of this activity.]

1.4. Proposed Roadshow Schedule. The roadshow will commence on June 2024 until 2025, covering selected areas nationwide, as follows:

Each event will consist of multi-sectoral morning sessions for local government officials and constituents in an LGU-provided venue, followed by a press conference. In the afternoon, sessions will be held at campus venues for students and faculty, local media, and Peace and Order Council engagements, focusing on the West Philippine Sea.

Regional centers that cannot be accommodated in the current year, 2024, will be carried over to the following year, 2025.

2. Logistics, Coordination, and Convergence.

- The DILG shall coordinate logistics, including venue selection and participant outreach. The LGU shall be requested to shoulder on-ground expenses through the DILG. A Department Order from DILG will mobilize officials and stakeholders across regional centers.
- In the Cebu and Cagayan de Oro legs, the "Takbo para sa WPS," a running event organized by the Philippine Coast Guard in collaboration with RUNRIO to raise awareness about the West Philippine Sea; will serve as the opening salvo of the Bagong Pilipinas Roadshow.
- In the Campus and Media Caravan titled "Waves of Contention: Issues, Prospects, and Challenges of the West Philippine Sea," the Commission on Higher Education (CHED) will mobilize students and faculty from various state and local universities and colleges, as well as private higher education institutions. Meanwhile, the Presidential Communications Office (PCO) and the Philippine Information Agency (PIA) will mobilize local media across the region. The responsibility for logistics will be shared by both CHED and PCO.

- PCO will also incorporate contests like essay and songwriting competitions into the regional setup, with awards presented at the roadshow, particularly in the combined Campus Caravan and Media Seminar.
- The "Oplan Layag," an initiative by the Bureau of Fisheries and Aquatic Resources (BFAR) which provides fishing boats to Filipino fishermen, will be conducted in selected venues facing the West Philippine Sea, supporting local fishermen in the area.
- The Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP) will be tapped to invite celebrity reservists to participate in the Bagong Pilipinas for a Free, Peaceful, and Secure Nation Roadshow. Their presence is expected to attract more attendees and generate greater interest and engagement in the event.

3. Roadshow Displays

- Pop-up Informational Exhibit. This will feature compelling infographics highlighting paramount national security concerns, with a particular emphasis on the West Philippine Sea (WPS).
 - The Atin Ito Coalition will collaborate to install a photo exhibit at a strategically chosen mall in the area, dedicated to raising awareness about the West Philippine Sea, beginning a week before the main roadshow.
 - Selected agencies are urged to participate by setting up informational exhibit at the multi-sectoral roadshow, which serves as a platform to underscore critical national security issues. Agencies have the flexibility to tailor their exhibit area setup according to their unique preferences and priorities, allowing them to effectively engage with attendees and contribute to the event's objectives.

- 3.2. Demonstration / Capability Booth: This offers hands-on experience where participants can don sample uniforms of the AFP, handle equipment, and take photos. This interactive setup aims to educate and inspire, showcasing the commitment and advancements in defense and security. It serves as a motivational platform for students and participants to consider joining the AFP and the PCG, and contributing to the nation's defense efforts.

- 3.3. Help Desk: This will provide assistance to farmers, fisher folks, and the community regarding their livelihood needs and training inquiries. These dedicated stations will offer guidance, resources, and support tailored to the specific requirements of each group, aiming to empower and uplift individuals in their respective fields.

- 3.4. Stores: DA's "Kadiwa ng Pangulo" program, renowned for its impact on local farming communities, will set up stores at the multi-sectoral event of the roadshow, contributing to food security. This farm-to-consumer market chain empowers local producers, enhancing their income by selling directly to consumers.
 - Department of Agriculture
- Media Coverage and Communication. The Presidential Communications Office (PCO) and the Philippine Information Agency (PIA) will coordinate media coverage and press conferences for maximum outreach.
- Collaterals. Ensure availability of collaterals for participants to take home.
 Collaterals will be provided by involved agencies, including BP booklets and promotional materials at booths. The Bureau of Communications Services of the Presidential Communications Office will be tapped to help produce collaterals.
- Call to Action. The roadshow will culminate with a call to action, encouraging stakeholders to support national security efforts. Proposed actions include lodging petitions urging China to adhere to international laws and passing LGU resolutions supporting the Philippine position in the West Philippine Sea.
- Strategic Feedback Mechanisms and Key Performance Indicators (KPIs). Feedback mechanisms will be deployed to gauge the efficacy of the roadshow. These KPIs will serve as vital metrics to assess progress and refine strategies accordingly.
